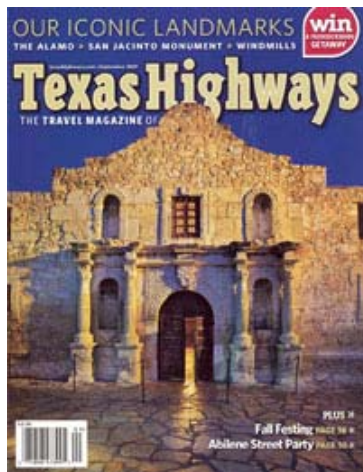

Rustling up the Rangers

IN 1968, MANUEL "LONE WOLF" Gonzauillas helped found the Texas Ranger Hall of Fame and Museum in Waco, which today serves as the principle repository for archives and artifacts relating to the Texas Rangers, the state's oldest law-enforcement agency. The collection includes Ranger badges, 19th-Century Colt firearms and other weapons, photographs, and displays recounting nearly two centuries' worth of Ranger history. Gonzauillas, one of 30 Rangers honored in the museum's Hall of Fame, bequeathed his scrapbooks and personal papers to the museum upon his death in 1977. Call 254/750-8631; www.texasranger.org.
