Have you wondered why museums have rules, such as "no running?" KQED and Bay Area Intelligence Service. In 2001 he was selected for the Texas Rangers and was promoted to lieutenant in 2005 and captain in 2008. His abilities earned him appointment Chief of the Texas Rangers. During his tenure the Texas

Ranger Division grew to 209 employees including 150 Texas Rangers.

Hank has been an energetic advocate on behalf of the museum and, as Chief, created a strong awareness of the value of the museum within DPS and on the Texas Public Safety Commission. He has arranged fundraising events, donated personal artifacts and archives, and arranged for the transfer of 40 years of Texas Ranger records to the museum.

# CSI: An Educational Program

Today the Texas Rangers are an elite crime investigation force. With state-of-the-art equipment at their disposal, the Texas Rangers piece together clues and solve crimes. An educational program of the museum makes it possible for students to learn about their use of modern forensics.

School and scout groups can book our Crime Scene **Investigator Training** educational program. It begins with a tour of the museum. After learning





about the Texas Rangers, students learn different investigative techniques to solve a mysterious theft.

One of the investigative tools students use is Chromatography. This is when one breaks down the various colors in ink samples to match the pen used in a note found at the crime scene.

The program is targeted for children ages 6 to 12. Reservations are required for all groups and must be made at least seven days in advance. Calling early in the school year will ensure that you receive your desired program date and time. Group size is limited to 25 total participants and availability is limited. # A Special Visit



On January 15th, staff members from The Comanche National Museum and Cultural Center in Lawton, Oklahoma and Texas Tech University visited on a grant funded project. Their purpose is to explore how the shared history of the Comanche, Anglo-Europeans, Tejanos and other Texas tribes is interpreted in Texas. Like Texas Ranger history,

Comanche history is far richer than commonly known. Between their arrival in Texas about 1705, and the reservation period beginning in the 1870s, they engaged in both warfare and far-reaching trade that spread over New Mexico, Texas and Louisiana. Our staff met with them to discuss that shared history and how the Texas Ranger and Comanche heritage centers may collaborate. Their goal is expressed by their museum motto "Lords of the Plains, Know Us."
