Lee Herring and the Surveyors' Fight

Lee Herring, Texas State Artist for 2007, has donated a painting depicting the 1838 Surveyors' Fight in Navarro County. A desperate battle, it involved a party of 23 surveyors and Texas Rangers against 300 Kickapoo, Tawakoni, Caddo Indians. Only seven Rangers and surveyors survived the fight.



Lee Herring was born in Rains County, and graduated from Texas A & M Commerce. After success as an illustrator, Lee has earned an international reputation as a western artist, portrait and landscape painter.

As is evident in his work, Herring is committed to historical accuracy. He travels to the places he depicts and researches every component. Herring's paintings are starkly realistic, yet highly individual, traditional subjects molded by the artist's interpretation.

Rick Miller's Collection

Rick Miller is one of the best known authors on frontier Texas. His books such as *John B. Jones and the Frontier Battalion* and *Sam Bass and Gang* have brought the era alive for thousands of readers.

Over the past three years, Mr. Miller has generously donated his extensive collection of books, magazines and microfilm dealing with the American West. The bulk of the collection covers lawmen and outlaw history of the southwest concentrating on Texas, New Mexico and Arizona. He also donated a large collection of Texas county and local histories.





During the celebration, Shelly Crittendon, Collections Manager, delivered a program on the conservation of the portrait and on other known paintings and photographs of Houston. This presentation was filmed for *Discovering the Legend*, a television series produced by the Waco City Cable Channel and distributed to over 50 City and College cable channels across Texas.


Military Appreciation Day


