


Admission to the event is free, tickets for All-you-can-eat fajitas and beans are \$10 for adults, \$5 for kids 5-10.

ATF Memorial Service

The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms held a 25 th anniversary memorial service for four Special Agents — Conway LeBleu, Todd McKeehan, Robert Williams and Steven Willis — who died in the raid on the Branch Davidian compound February 28, 1993.

Thomas E. Brandon, Acting Director of the Bureau, led the memorial service. He noted that lessons learned and sacrifices of the tragedy resulted in significant changes in training and procedures implemented in such situations.

More than 300 officers from local, State and Federal various agencies and family members of the fallen attended the commemoration held in John Knox Memorial Center.
