Texas Rangers 200th Anniversary Badge Exhibit

In commemoration of the 200th anniversary of the Texas Rangers, the TRHFM Collections Division has installed an exhibit on perhaps the most iconic symbol of the Rangers, the circle-star badge.

For most of their history the Rangers did not wear badges but carried commissions or Warrants of Authority. The first known references to Texas Ranger badges dates to the 1870s, commissioned by private citizens and presented as tokens of appreciation for their services. The earliest authenticated circle-star Ranger badges were worn by Rangers in Ira Aten's company in the 1880s, made from Mexican 8 Peso silver coins, a tradition the Rangers continue today with five-Peso coins. The Rangers received their first state-issued badges when they became a division of the Texas Department of Public Safety in 1935—over 100 years after their founding in 1823. The current badge design, with design elements from the Texas State Seal, dates to 1961-62.



"History of the Texas Ranger Badge" details a portion of the history of the iconic symbol, the use of both silver and gold Mexican Pesos in the creation of the badges, and features badges crafted by Kevin Johnson of Johnson Bits and Spurs and Rick Lopez of Lopez Engraving, two of the silversmiths authorized by the Texas Department of Public Safety.

The exhibit is currently on display in the Morris Gallery. An exhibit on commissions, Warrants of Authority and badges from 1880s to the 1960s in the Garrison Gallery.

Exhibit at Fort Worth Museum of Science and History

On January 13th, the Fort Worth Museum of Science and History opened an exhibit in honor of the 200th anniversary of the Texas Rangers. Organized at the request of Texas Ranger 2023, Inc., the State Bicentennial Committee, the exhibit features artifacts on loan from the Texas Ranger Hall of Fame and Museum and artifacts from the Fort Worth Museum's history collection. The two staffs coordinated closely together on a tight schedule to create an impressive presentation that premiered during the annual Fort Worth Stock Show and Rodeo and will be on display through the end of the year.





Some of the artifacts featured in the exhibit include a brick from Texas Ranger Captain Samuel Walker's Maryland home, a Federal Gas Riot Gun from Texas Rangers Headquarters, and a Field Negotiation Phone from Ranger John Vance, Ret.

The Colt Monitor: A Rare Piece of "Roaring Twenties & Gangster Era" History and Technology



Research into history and artifacts at the TRHFM is ongoing, and new discoveries are intriguing discoveries are made each year. In 2022 Collections Assistant Eric Richard began to look into a rare firearm in our collection known as a Colt Automatic Machine Rifle R80, better known as a Colt Monitor

It was a special version of the World War I Browning Automatic Rifle developed for J. Edgar Hoover's FBI and law enforcement to counter violent and well armed criminals such as John Dillinger, "Pretty Boy" Floyd and "Machine Gun" Kelly. Apocryphal stories claimed that the museum's Colt Monitor was owned by legendary retired Texas Ranger Captain Frank Hamer, known for the pursuit of the Barrow Gang ("Bonnie and Clyde"). Oral history held that this was the Colt Monitor used by lawman Ted Hinton in the 1934 ambush that ended the crime spree of Bonnie and Clyde.

The original objective was to document the history of this particular rifle, but it developed into a detailed investigation into the history of these fascinating rifles. Book Signing for Texas Secessionists Standoff

On April 27, 1997, followers of Richard McLaren and his "Republic of Texas" militia held Joe and Margaret Ann Rowe hostage inside their own home at the Davis Mountain Resort, near Fort Davis, Texas. They demanded the release of jailed militia members Jo



Ann Turner and Robert Jonathan Scheidt. McLaren's demand initiated a seven-day standoff with local law enforcement and the Texas Rangers that came to be called the "Republic of Texas War."

As the 25th anniversary of the event approached, author Donna Marie Miller wanted to preserve the history of this infamous seven-day standoff with the Texas Rangers. She interviewed both Retired Captain Barry Caver and retired Ranger Jess Malone about the event. The book was accepted into the Bicentennial Publications program of the Texas Ranger Hall of Fame and Museum which recognizes 18 books of significance to Texas Ranger history.



On December 30th, TRHFM hosted a book signing and author presentation on the standoff in the Davis Mountains. Author Donna Marie Miller, Ret. Capt. Barry Caver, incident commander, and Ret. Ranger Jess Malone, lead negotiator, presented firsthand accounts and signed copies of books purchased that day. The museum gift shop has copies of the book available for purchase. WCCCTV was on hand to film the presentation for a future "Discovering the Legend" episode and for a transcription into a PDF to be accessible on TRHFM website.
