A Look Back at the Bicentennial 2023

2023 marked the 200th anniversary of the founding of the Texas Rangers. They are the oldest existing law enforcement agency with statewide jurisdiction and the only one to have served under five national flags. In cooperation with Texas DPS and the Texas Rangers Division, lead agency Texas Ranger 2023, the Texas Ranger Association Foundation and many more cities and sponsors, we participated in a State-wide celebration and educational experience. The kick-off began in January at the Fort Worth Stock Show and Rodeo and then traveled to: Midland, Houston, Waco, Lubbock, San Antonio, Fort Worth, the Dallas State Fair, McAllen and Austin. We were privileged to be invited to participate and represent the museum. It was a busy and wonderful year that we will always remember.

Bob has authored 18 books and enjoys traveling to the physical locations of the places he researches for his books. There wasn't an empty chair in Surfside City Hall as Alexander told the story of the Texas Rangers.

He felt that commemorating 200 years of Texas Ranger history was not just a milestone, but important to the core of Texas history. "It's wonderful," Alexander said. "It's what it takes to keep our heritage alive. No matter who we are, we have to record it and share it, and that's what we're doing, especially with local historians and historical organizations. Since I'm now retired, I started primarily writing about the Old West and the Texas Rangers as they make the transition from their earlier days into the modern era, and the law enforcement that they're involved in today."


